# PURPOSE

<ul> <li>Minimise the adverse environmental impacts of the Mentoring program by improving the efficiency of resource consumption and the selection and use of appropriate materials, processes, equipment and services, such as but not limited to: <ul> <li>Reducing waste by using reusable or biodegradable materials wherever possible</li> <li>Limit printing and use digital versions of documentation when available</li> <li>Recycle any unwanted materials such as paper, cardboard etc and/or look for any recycling options available for unwanted items before discarding in the general waste</li> <li>Donate any unwanted items that are still in usable condition</li> <li>Where possible reuse and recycle materials, purchase recycled materials and use recyclable packaging or other similar materials</li> <li>promote energy efficiency by turning off lights and electronics when not in use and by using natural light and ventilation as much as possible</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	X

<ul> <li>When planning Activity days:</li> <li>Where possible, book activities with venues that have sustainable practices and values and that are easily accessible by public transport</li> <li>Encourage the use of public transport or car pool where possible</li> <li>Encourage all participants to bring reusable water bottles and to avoid single-use plastic products during program activities</li> <li>Limit food waste by not over purchasing and try to avoid the use of products packaged in single use plastics</li> <li>Encourage any left-over food to be taken home and/or discarded in compost or council collection green bins</li> </ul>	X	X	X	X
